I hope you are doing well. Shown below is a short legislative update you could read at an upcoming Catholic Daughters meeting and/or add to a court newsletter.

The Minnesota State Legislature is adjourned until February 12th, 2024, so it may seem like there's nothing going on, but committee meetings are being held now, so it's still a good time to make your voices heard. The Minnesota Catholic Conference website has information and an easy way to email legislators about pro-life issues, such as baby items tax exemptions, assisted suicide, online child exploitation, and educational choices for children. Court St. Margaret, Eveleth, MN sponsors a pro-life program and we encourage our members to pray for pro-life both individually and as a group.

Recently, one of our former CDA sisters, Genny Spollar, came up with the idea to knit infant hats. She loves to knit and wanted to do something in memory of the daughter of a dear friend who passed away a few years ago. So, she began to knit hats for full term and premature babies. (Keep in mind that all of her time and all of the yarn are donated by her.)

These little hats were in an array of colors and just beautifully made. She made them by the dozens to give away and to promote the "choose life" motto. She was aware of our pro-life program in Court St.

Margaret and wanted her Catholic Daughter sisters to distribute them as part of that program.

About 100 of these precious hats were initially given to the maternity ward at the Fairview Hospital in Hibbing, MN, and were greatly appreciated by them. Several dozen were distributed to OB/GYN doctor's offices in the area. She continued to knit another 400 hats, 200 of each size. We delivered 200 of these to the Epiphany Caring for Life Center in Coon Rapids, MN, and 100 each to Essentia Health Center and St. Luke's Hospitals in Duluth, MN. The Caring for Life Center had several pregnant mothers with multiples at that time and were especially happy to get the "premie" hats.

Genny continues to knit more hats and many of these will be going to the Family Life Center in Hibbing and Virginia, MN. We look forward to continuing with this project as long as possible.

If anyone knows of a pro-life program that would be interested in receiving these hats, please notify one of our CDA members.

Ham Quiche

Servings: 8 Prep Time: 5 min Gluten Free: No

Ingredients:

- 1 Jones Dairy Farm Ham Steak, cut into strips
- 1/2 Cup Red Bell Pepper, Cut into strips
- 1/2 Cup Asparagus, Chopped
- 1/3 Cup Leek, Sliced
- 1 Cup Shredded Swiss Cheese
- 2 TBS Flour
- 1 unbaked Pie crust fitted into a 9" pie plate
- 13/8 Cup Half & Half or Whipping Cream
- 4 eggs, Slightly beaten



Directions:

- 1 Preheat oven to 425 Degrees F.
- 2 Combine Ham, Pepper, asparagus, leek, cheese and flour: toss lightly.
- 3 Transfer Ham mixture to prepared pie crust.
- 4 Gently mix Half & Half and eggs, then pour egg mixture over Ham mixture.
- 5 Bake 10 minutes at 425F: reduce heat to 325F.
- 6 Continue baking 20 minutes or until done.


